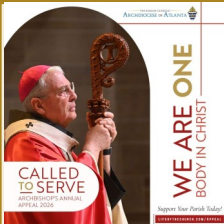
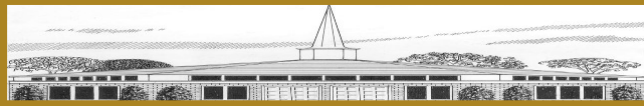

Gospel Reading

Sunday, August 16, 2026

Matthew 15:21-28

Jesus heals the daughter of the Canaanite woman because of her great faith.

In today's Gospel, a woman, who is not Jewish, approaches Jesus, requesting that he heal her demon-possessed daughter. At first Jesus ignores her; he says nothing. The disciples ask Jesus to send her away, and Jesus agrees, remarking that he was sent to minister to the Jews alone.

The woman persists, paying homage to Jesus, and yet Jesus denies her request again. He even insults her, using a Jewish word of derision for Gentiles, "dog." But the woman cleverly turns Jesus' insult into an affirmation of faith. Only then does Jesus grant her request and heal her daughter.

Jesus' unresponsiveness to this woman may strike us as uncharacteristic or shocking. Yet in Matthew's Gospel, Jesus' ministry is directed primarily to the people of Israel. At only a very few points, such as the one found in today's Gospel, do we find Jesus anticipating the later Christian ministry to the rest of the world.

Behind Matthew's text we can hear this early Christian community's struggle to understand how God's selection of Israel is consistent with two events: Israel's rejection of Jesus and the Gentiles' acceptance of Jesus. Just as Jesus was surprised by the faith expressed by the Canaanite woman, so too the first Christians were surprised that the Gentiles would receive the salvation God offered through Christ. In today's second reading from Paul's letter to the Romans, we hear the apostle Paul considering this same concern.

The faith that the Canaanite woman expresses is an affirmation of and confidence in God's abundant mercy. Yes, salvation comes through Israel, but it overflows for the benefit of all.

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Words Are Important!

Words are powerful. The words used by both sides of the life issue clearly and frequently shape the value system of society. Semantics is a critical part of the abortion debate. When pro-abortion activists first adopted the word "pro-choice," it was certainly no accident. The phrase had a specific intention to elicit a strong emotional response and infer that abortion was a personal freedom. Any time we call them "pro-choice," we reinforce their argument (and subterfuge) and help them disguise what the "choice" really involves, namely terminating innocent human life. Therefore, we must always call them pro-abortion. In recent years, the pro-abortion movement has adopted new, misleading language. Phrases like "reproductive rights" or "reproductive justice" are an attempt to expand and convolute the debate and the issues. Make no mistake, the crux of their efforts is abortion and the massive profits that industry generates. So, our words must reflect their true intention, which tragically is abortion-on-demand. Please make a commitment that your words will always be life-affirming. Innocent lives hang in the balance, so we must do our level best to protect them.

From St. Faustina's Diary Completely in My Care

May 1, [1938]. This evening, Jesus said to me, **My daughter, do you need anything?** I answered, "O my Love, when I have You I have everything." And the Lord answered, **If souls would put themselves completely in My care, I Myself would undertake the task of sanctifying them, and I would lavish even greater graces on them. There are souls who thwart My efforts, but I have not given up on them; as often as they turn to Me, I hurry to their aid, shielding them with My mercy, and I give them the first place in My compassionate Heart** (*Diary*, 1682).

Lord Jesus, I desire to put myself completely in Your care. Please undertake the task of sanctifying me. Without Your grace, I can do nothing! But with Your grace, I can do anything, because then all things are possible: "In Him I have strength for everything through Him who empowers me" (Phil 4:13).

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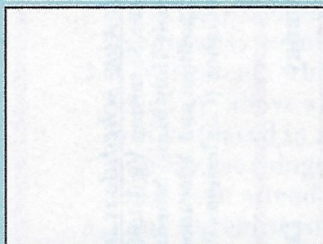
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
